Paradise Cheer is a growing organization currently finalizing a location for the 2026-2027 season. Details regarding uniform fittings, evaluations, the first week of practice, and choreography—including dates and location—will be announced when registration opens.

Program Policies

The following policies are designed to support the safety, development, and success of all Paradise Cheer athletes. As cheerleading is a team sport, adherence to these guidelines helps ensure a positive and rewarding experience for everyone.

Financial Obligations

By enrolling a cheerleader in Paradise Cheer families agree to pay all required participation fees. All required fees must be paid according to the payment schedule as outlined and agreed upon with Paradise Cheer. Failure to remain current on required payments may impact a cheerleader's ability to participate in practices, competitions, or team events. **Please note that all program fees and tuition are non-refundable once paid, including in the event of withdrawal, dismissal, or injury.**

Practice Attendance

Competition cheer requires a significant time and attendance commitment. Consistent attendance from all athletes is essential for safely and successfully practicing stunts, pyramids, and choreography. All practices are considered mandatory. Excessive or unapproved absences may impact an athlete's placement, performance readiness, or eligibility.

Families acknowledge and agree to the following attendance expectations:

- **August–September (Limited Flexibility Period):** With prior approval from the coaching staff, athletes may miss practices due to vacation or family commitments. Requests must be submitted in advance and approval is not guaranteed.
- **Choreography Week:** All athletes must attend choreography week. Absences are not permitted, as choreography is critical to athlete safety, team synchronization, and competition readiness.
- **Two Months Prior to Competition:** Absences during this period will only be considered for illness or emergencies and are subject to coaching staff discretion.
- **Approved Reasons for Absence:**
 - Contagious illness and/or fever or as advised by a medical professional with a doctor's note.
 - School functions that impact academic standing.
 - Death in the family.
 - Family obligations or events during the limited flexibility period.
- **Injury:** Injured athletes should attend practice to observe and learn choreography and may resume participation as cleared by their doctor. All concussions must be cleared by a doctor to resume participation.

Parent Conduct

Parents are expected to maintain positive and respectful conduct toward all athletes, families, and staff of Paradise Cheer at all times. Any concerns should be addressed with coaches after practice or during a scheduled break. Disruptions to practice are not permitted.

Program Policies

Continued

Uniform & Appearance Requirements

Families agree to purchase, maintain, and ensure proper use of all required uniforms and accessories. Cheerleaders must adhere to Paradise Cheer standards for uniform fit, appearance, hair, makeup, and accessories at all practices, competitions, and events.

Competition Expectations

All athletes are required to attend competitions. Competition fees are paid in advance and are non-refundable for any reason. Due to the impact on choreography and team readiness, **a \$100 fee will be assessed for any missed competition not due to injury.**

Families are responsible for transportation and lodging, if needed. Hotel information will be shared for out-of-town events; staying with the team is optional unless the event is designated "Stay to Play."

Most competitions charge a spectator admission fee, which varies by event. Families are responsible for these fees. Athlete entry fees are included in the program competition fee.

Athletes and parents represent Paradise Cheer at all events. Good conduct and sportsmanship is expected of all athletes and parents at all times. Athletes must arrive on time, wear makeup and hair as instructed, wear Paradise warm-ups, and remain at the event for awards. Competition details will be provided prior to each event.

Piercing Policy

Athletes may not perform with any piercings. Clear spacers, tape, or bandages are not permitted. Piercings are a USASF safety violation and may result in deductions or disqualification; therefore, new piercings during the season are strongly discouraged.

During practice, stud earrings only are permitted. Any exposed piercings or hoops must be removed. Failure to comply will result in the athlete being unable to participate in practice and the absence being considered unexcused.

Program Involvement

Paradise Cheer relies on family involvement to create a successful program and a positive experience for all athletes. The following involvement policies are in place to support a smooth and successful season.

Team Experience Fund

Paradise Cheer maintains a centralized Team Experience Fund to support optional but meaningful team activities, including competition gifts, spirit items, team celebrations, and end-of-season gifts. This fund helps eliminate repeated collections and ensures consistency across teams, rather than relying on individual families. Each family is required to contribute \$200 per cheerleader per season to the Team Experience Fund.

Volunteer Time Requirement

Each family is requested to contribute a minimum of two (2) volunteer hours per season. Volunteer hours may be completed by one or multiple parents or guardians and may be fulfilled across multiple opportunities until the requirement is met. Parents serving as team experience leads, outlined below, are considered to have fulfilled this requirement. Opportunities for volunteer hours will be shared throughout the season.

Team Experience Volunteer Leads

The following roles play an important part in creating a positive team experience at Paradise Cheer and are available for each team. Families who serve in one of these roles will have their volunteer hour requirement fulfilled and will receive a \$50 credit toward their cheerleader's Team Experience Fund, reducing the fee from \$200 to \$150. There are a maximum of five roles/credits available per team. If the role is unfulfilled, no credit will be issued and funds will remain in the Team Experience Fund.

Team Experience Volunteer Lead Boundaries: Team Moms and Volunteer Leads are responsible for coordination and oversight only and will not be expected to spend personal funds or cover incomplete volunteer commitments. If an activity cannot be completed as planned, the team may proceed with a simplified alternative.

Paradise Cheer is committed to transparent pricing and providing one of the most affordable All Star Cheer programs in the greater Richmond area.

REGISTRATION FEES

Uniform Fee*	\$350	*Only for new cheerleaders or cheerleaders who outgrew previous uniform. To be paid at time of registration, if needed.
Registration Fee (Non-Refundable)	\$300	Supports choreography fee and upfront expenses incurred by gym. To be paid upfront at time of registration.

Gym Fees	\$500	Contributes towards team gym rental fees and use of practice space. Billed as \$50/month over 10 months.

Payment Options

Families may choose from two payment options at registration. Registration and uniform fees are paid separately, and the plans below outline payment of the remaining \$1,365 in program fees.

Families who join the program after August 1 are still responsible for the full season program cost, as enrollment reflects a commitment to the entire season. New families will be asked to bring their account current upon joining.

Enrollment will close on October 1 to support team consistency and preparation.
